Key lesson: Grammar and Punctuation

Recap - Using *or*, *and*, *but*.

I do:

Conjunctions are joining words that link together parts of a sentence. The three main coordinating conjunctions are 'and', 'but' and 'or'.

They can be used to join together two clauses in a sentence. However, the clauses need to make sense on their own.

For example:

Kaiya ran for the bus. It had already left.

You can add the coordinating conjunction 'but' in between these clauses so the sentence reads:

Kaiya ran for the bus but it had already left.

Remember though, you can often leave out the subject word in the second coordinating clause. For example:



Capital letters for people, places and I.

I do:

Capital letters are used to start a sentence but they are also used for names of people, places, days of the weeks, months, years and the names of religious festivals. We also use capital letters when we are referring to our self using the word I.

For example:

My friend Polly visited London on Sunday.

In this sentence, Polly, London and Sunday have a capital letter that is because they are names. Polly is the name of someone, London is the name of somewhere and Sunday is the name of a day of the week.

My friend and I climbed to the top of the Monument.

In this sentence, I also has a capital letter. When you are writing about yourself; I is always written with a capital letter.
